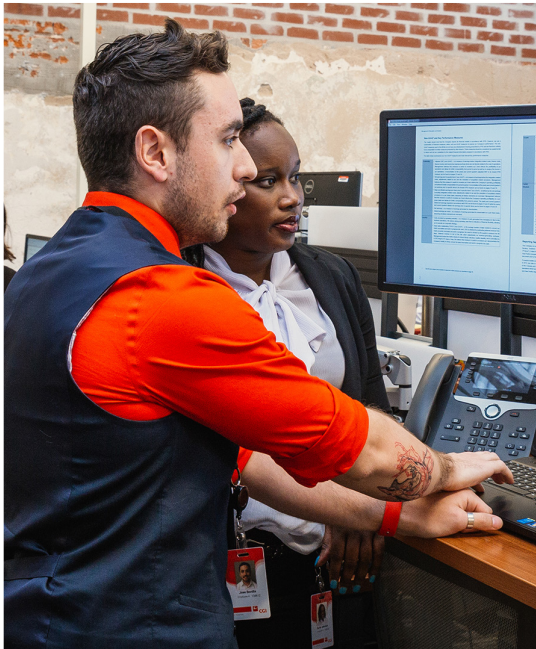

With an estimated population of more than 255,000, the centrally-located parish (county) of **Lafayette** serves as an economic center of south Louisiana. The region's legendary joie de vivre and Cajun and Creole cultures are known around the globe, creating a unique environment for work and play. Lafayette is home to a world-class workforce, an integrated transportation network, a diversified business base, preeminent high-tech infrastructure, and a metropolitan appeal. With this foundation, Lafayette Parish is able to foster an economy that supports a growing population and diverse industry sectors.

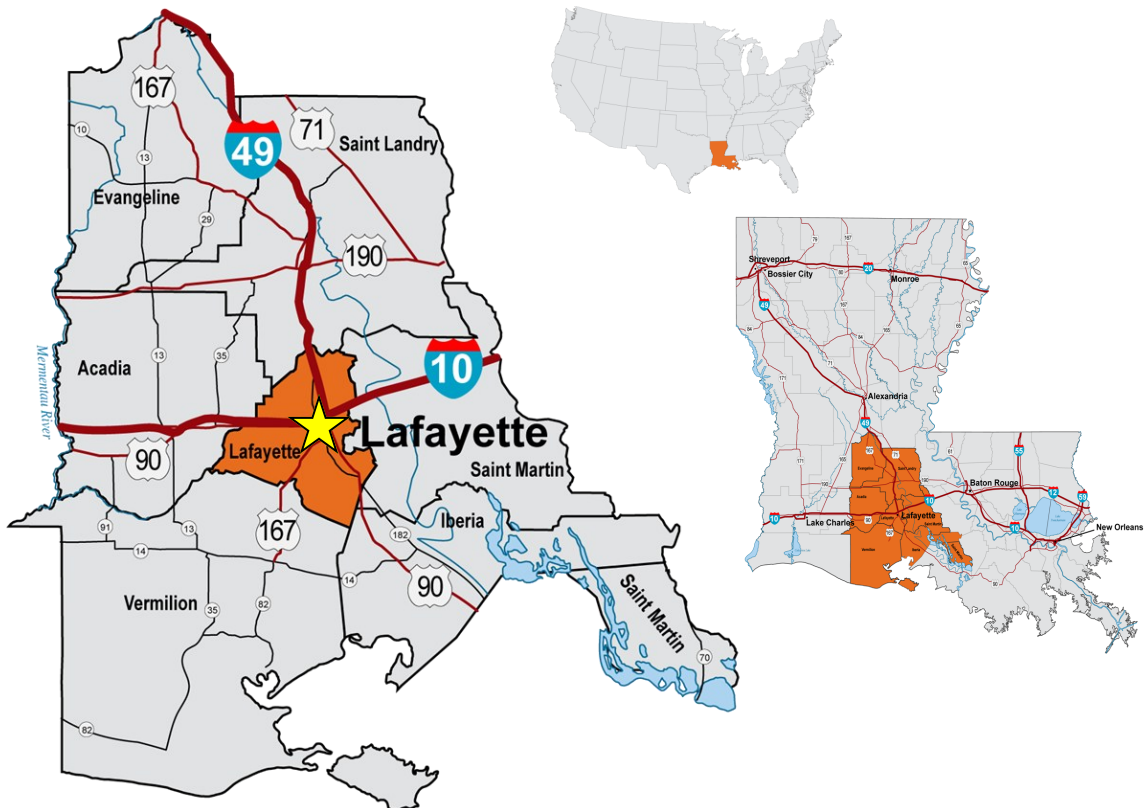
Market Access	The intersection of Interstates 10 and 49 is a strategic advantage in transportation and accessibility into and out of the parish. Additionally, Lafayette can be easily reached by the Union Pacific and Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railways, the Lafayette Regional Airport, and the Intercoastal Waterway. The ports of West St. Mary, Vermilion, Iberia, Greater Baton Rouge and the Twin Parish Port are also within 50 miles of Lafayette.
Incentives	Federal, State and local governments provide an assortment of business incentives that are available to incoming companies and to those existing within Lafayette Parish. Financing assistance, tax abatements and training programs are a few examples of the benefits available.
Workforce	The Lafayette MSA has a civilian labor force of more than 209,000 individuals. A highly educated workforce is emerging as more students are enrolling and graduating from the university and community college. Local businesses are also taking advantage of development and training programs to educate and enhance the skills of their new and existing employees.
Business Base	Lafayette has diversified by positioning itself as a medical, transportation, finance, technology, entertainment, education and retail hub. The business base of the parish includes energy services, manufacturing, health care, transportation and distribution, education, technology, finance, tourism, and other service-related industries.
Infrastructure	Publicly owned and operated, Lafayette Utilities System (LUS) provides the City of Lafayette with electric, water, and wastewater services that are among the lowest priced in the state. LFT Fiber provides some of the fastest internet in the world to customers in the City of Lafayette and some surrounding areas— with speeds up to 10 Gbps.
Quality of Life	The region's legendary joie de vivre and Cajun and Creole culture are known around the globe, creating a unique environment for work and play. Local museums, community events, and festivals provide modern-day arts and culture with a southern flair. The subtropical climate of the "Sportsman's Paradise" is enjoyable in dozens of parks and recreational facilities around Lafayette Parish. Lafayette serves as a hospitable, safe and family-friendly center for retail, education, recreation, and health care. #

Taxes

Corporate Franchise Tax

- The Louisiana corporate franchise tax has been repealed effective January 1, 2026.

Corporate Income Tax

- Louisiana now offers a single-rate income tax structure, reducing administrative and compliance costs and encouraging expansion and investment.
- Flat corporate income tax rate of 5.5%, with a standard deduction of \$20,000.
- Federal income taxes are deductible in computing net taxable income.

Property Tax

- No state property tax in Louisiana.
- 2026 Lafayette City and Parish property tax millage is 104.025 mills.
- For property outside of the city limits of Lafayette, the total millage is 87.11.
- Several types of exemptions are available in Lafayette Parish. If you own property that you reside in, you may apply for homestead exemption which reduces the taxable value of your home by \$75,000, resulting in substantial savings on your property taxes.

INCENTIVES FINANCING TAXES



Sales Tax

- Sales tax is levied on the retail sale of personal property, goods used or stored for use in Louisiana and on leases and rentals of tangible personal property and certain services.
- Louisiana state sales tax is 5.0%.
- Lafayette Parish sales tax is 2.0%
- Municipal sales tax:
 - City of Lafayette and areas outside all city limits: 2.0%
 - City of Broussard: 2.5%
 - City of Scott: 3.0%
 - City of Carencro and Town of Duson: 3.0%
 - City of Youngsville : 3.5%
- There are special taxing districts and economic development districts in the parish that levy additional taxes for infrastructure improvements. A list of those can be found at www.lataonline.org.

Education & Training Programs

LED FastStart Program

- A single-source workforce solution that works with businesses to anticipate and address a company's workforce needs early in the startup or expansion process.
- Eligibility: manufacturing, corporate headquarters, warehouse and distribution, research and development or other strategic facility that commits to creating at least 15 new jobs or a service-related operation that commits to creating at least 50 new jobs.

On-The-Job Training Program

- Provides reimbursement to employers of up to 50% of employee wages for up to 12 months for employer-based training for new hires.
- Offers payment assistance to employers with job openings.

Incumbent Worker Training Program

- Assists in the skill development of existing employees by providing funding for customized workforce training.
- Funded by Unemployment Tax contributions.
- Eligibility: a business must have operated in Louisiana and contributed to the State's Unemployment Insurance System for a minimum of three years.
- An employer or a consortium of employers with similar needs must have at least 15 employees to be trained.

Small Business Employee Training Program (SBET)

- Assists in the skill development of existing employees by providing funding for standardized training.
- Funded by Unemployment Tax contributions.
- Eligibility: limited to businesses with 50 or fewer employees. A business must have operated in Louisiana and contribute to the state's Unemployment Insurance System for a minimum of three years.
- Provides \$3,000 per employee, per fiscal year for standardized workforce training.

WORKFORCE & LABOR



Acadiana Workforce Solutions

- American Job Centers maintained by the Louisiana Workforce Commission and the region's workforce development board is federally-funded by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act
- Houses the largest state database of qualified job seekers; Job listings and a variety of integrated business workforce services are provided by a local business service team.
- Employers' job listings are listed on Louisiana Workforce Commission website, www.laworks.net.

South Louisiana Community College: Lafayette Campus (www.solacc.edu)

- Offers more than 50 programs, leading to associate degrees, technical diplomas, and certificates to approximately 12,000 students annually.
- Licensed by the Board of Regents of the State of Louisiana and is recognized by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.
- Provides a wide range of workforce training programs to rapidly increase skills of workers that align with industry needs.

University of Louisiana at Lafayette (www.louisiana.edu)

- Second largest university in Louisiana with an enrollment of more than 16,000 students.
- Offers 106 undergraduate degree programs, 40 master's degree programs, one post master's certificate program, and 10 doctorate degrees programs.
- University Research Park is home to CGI, NOAA, U.S. Geological Survey, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and more.
- Research Centers and Institutes: Cecil J. Picard Center for Child Development and Lifelong Learning, Ecology Center, Energy Institute, Informatics Research Institute, Center for Business and Information Technologies, National Incident Management Systems and Advanced Technologies Institute, Institute for Coastal and Water Research, Louisiana Immersive Technologies Enterprise, Marine Survival Training Center, New Iberia Research Center, and more.
- The Continuing Education department provides customized and standardized workforce training for business and industry. An approved provider of IWTP-funded training in the region.
- The University of Louisiana at Lafayette has earned the prestigious Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education's R1 designation, signifying very high research activity. This places the university among the top tier of research universities in the US.

BUSINESS BASE



Major Industries in Lafayette Parish

Lafayette Parish serves as a diverse business base for prominent leaders in many industries.

Construction: New concepts in residential development, combined with improvements made by local government, the University, and private business has propelled the construction industry forward in commercial activity. In 2025, construction activity reached more than \$421 million.

Retail Trade/Leisure & Hospitality/Entertainment: More than 20% of retail spending in Lafayette Parish is made by shoppers who live outside of the Parish's borders. People from across the Acadiana region travel here for shopping, entertainment, recreation, dining, professional services and business. The population in Lafayette's trade market is more than 600,000 people; and more than one million tourists visit this area every year.

Finance: The financial industry within the Lafayette market is comprised of 43 locally-owned and nationally-operated banking institutions, with an estimated \$15.2 billion in deposits as of July 2026. They provide services ranging from simple savings and checking accounts to complex commercial investments. There are eleven active credit unions within the Parish, with estimated total assets more than \$534 million in July 2026.

Manufacturing: The innovation of local manufacturers has resulted in the transformation of traditionally low-technology industries into modern high-tech environments through state-of-the-art computers, intelligent manufacturing systems, robotics, and automation. Thriving manufacturing businesses in Lafayette can be found across sectors including jewelry, oil and gas, marine, food production, and specialty metals.

Medical/Healthcare: At the heart of Lafayette's medical industry, is cutting edge communication and data transfer thanks to the area's high speed fiber optic network. Lafayette MSA's evolving medical workforce of more than 33,000 employees continues to expand with growing facilities. As the "Hub City" of the region, Lafayette is further cementing its role as a regional health center—attracting specialized treatment centers, and along with them preeminent physicians, researchers and scientists.

Energy: With hundreds oil-and-gas-related businesses in Lafayette, the region is the hub for energy production and services in the southeastern U.S. and the Gulf of Mexico. Our community provides an industry-savvy environment and a workforce that is highly skilled, making Lafayette very attractive—not only to energy companies, but to companies across industries. Local businesses are positioning themselves at the forefront of the energy transition and the next wave of energy innovation.

Technology: Lafayette has worked hard to create a business climate attractive to technology-intensive industries with technology infrastructure, skilled workers, research institutions, and economic development incentives. Within two years, four companies announced the creation of more than 1,100 technology jobs in Lafayette, cementing the region's reputation as a technology hub in the South.

Transportation/Distribution: Located at the crossroads of Interstates 10 and 49, Lafayette's strategic location has contributed to the viability of the transportation/distribution industry. Cargo can be delivered via the Intracoastal Waterway; and the proximity of Lafayette to the Gulf of Mexico makes deliveries and exports by sea feasible.

Aviation: Propelled by offshore transportation companies since the 1970s, Lafayette has emerged as a thriving hub for value-add for the aviation and aerospace industries through a cluster of MROs, manufacturers and pilot training.

Recreation

- Moncus Park at the Horse Farm is a 100-acre park located in central Lafayette. Construction on the park began in 2018; and the park opened to the public in January 2022. 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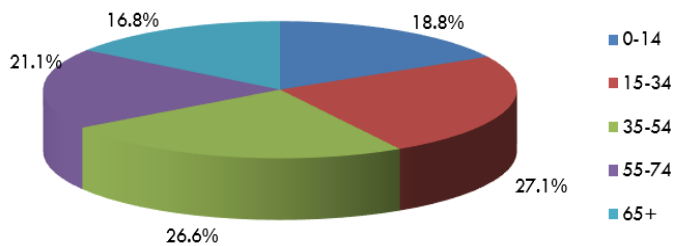

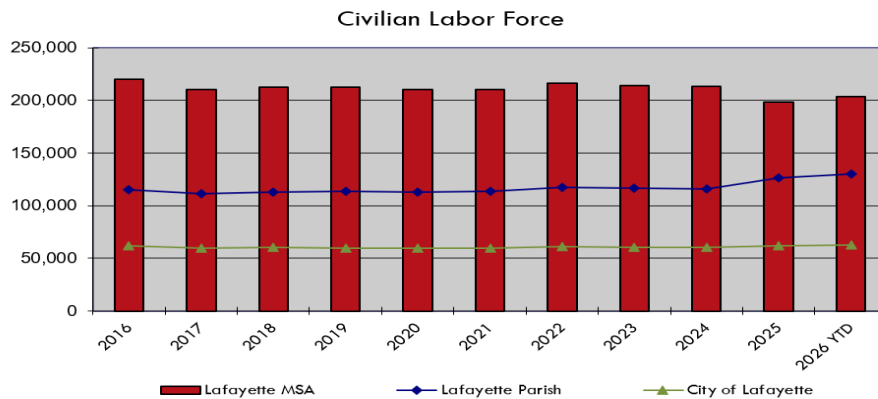

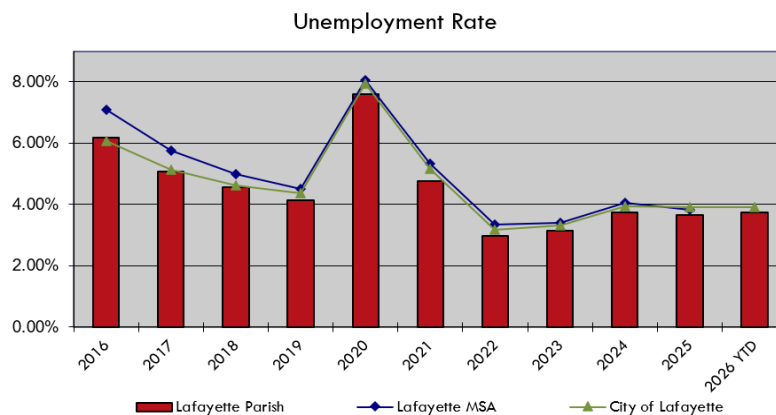

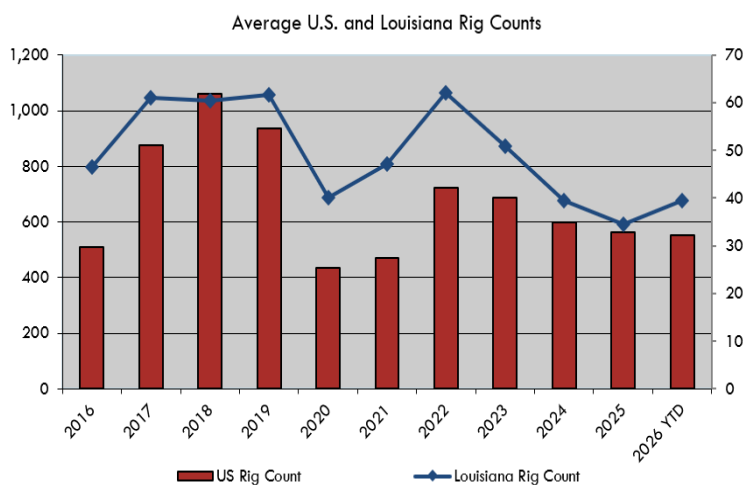

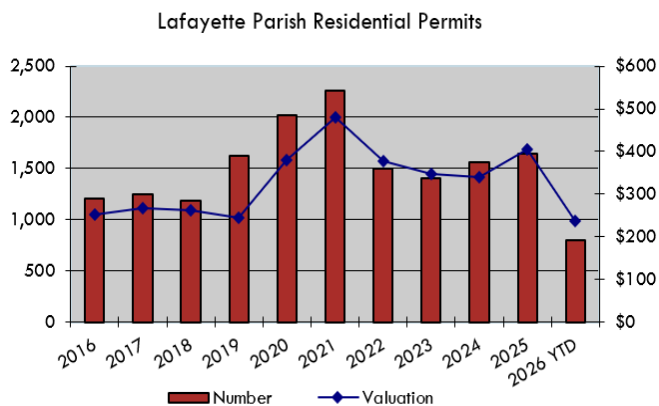

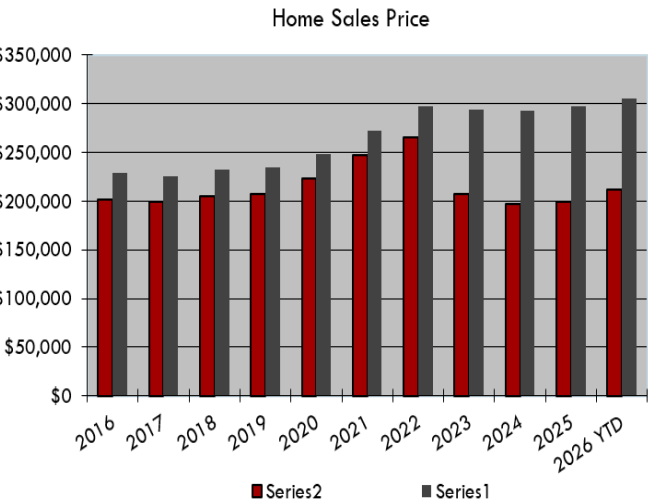

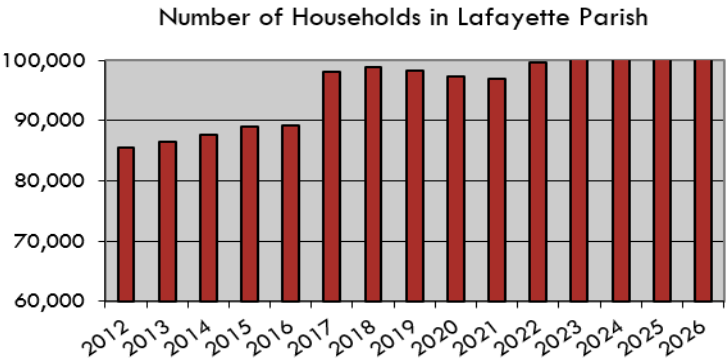

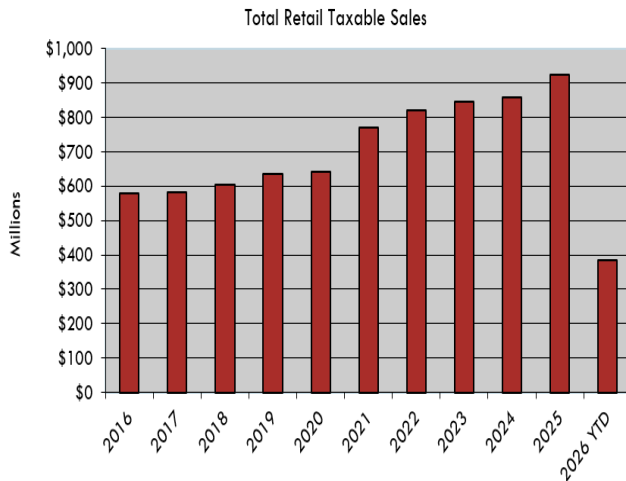

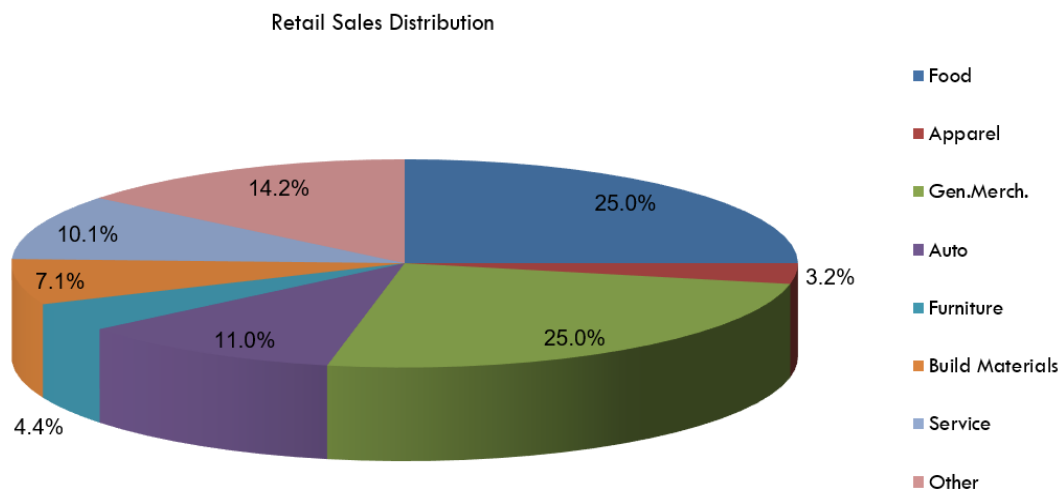

Cost of Living

Introduction

The Council for Community and Economic Research, a non-profit organization promoting excellence in research for community and economic development, developed the *Cost of Living Index* to provide a useful and reasonably accurate measure of living cost differences among urban areas. The Index measures differences in the cost of consumer goods and services for professional and managerial households in the top income quintile.

The Index average is equal to 100 and each participant's index is read as a percentage of the average. For example: Lafayette's composite index is 87.5— 12.5% below the national average. These percentages are based on the cost of 50+ items.

How would the *Cost of Living Index* be useful to you?

Suppose you live in Houston, TX, which has a composite index of 94.2 and you are thinking about accepting a new job in Lafayette, LA, which has a composite index of 87.5. How much of an increase or decrease in your after-taxes income will you need to maintain your present lifestyle?

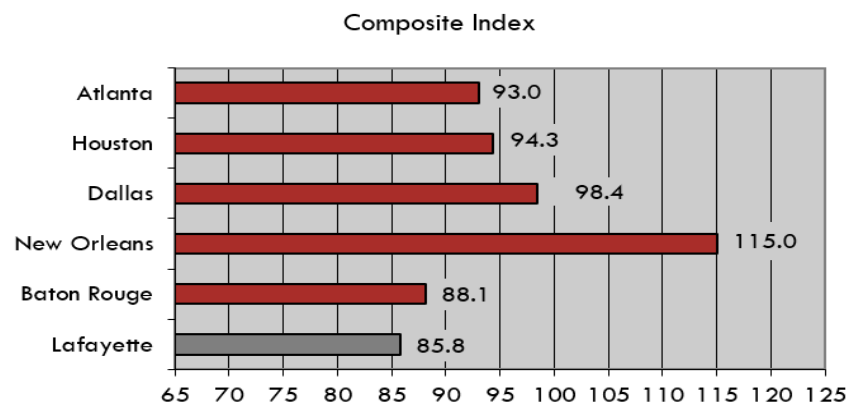
$$100 * [(87.5 - 94.2) / 94.2] = -7.11\%$$

Your after-taxes income could decrease by 7.11% and still maintain your present lifestyle. Keep in mind, this index does not take taxes into account.

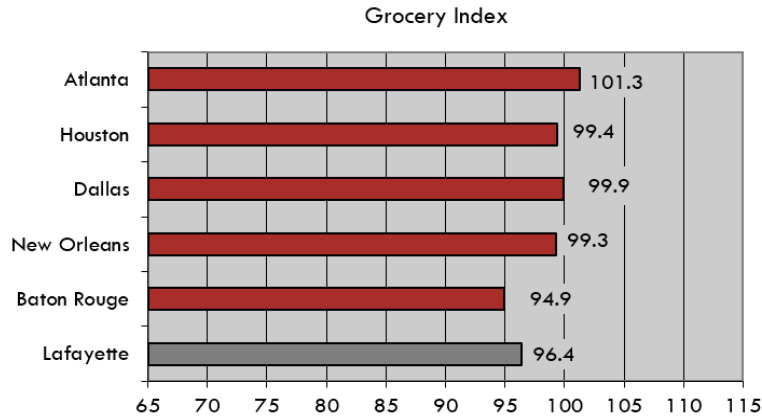

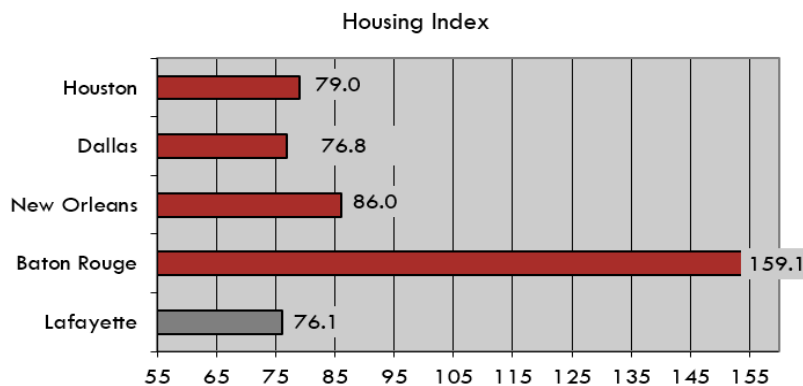

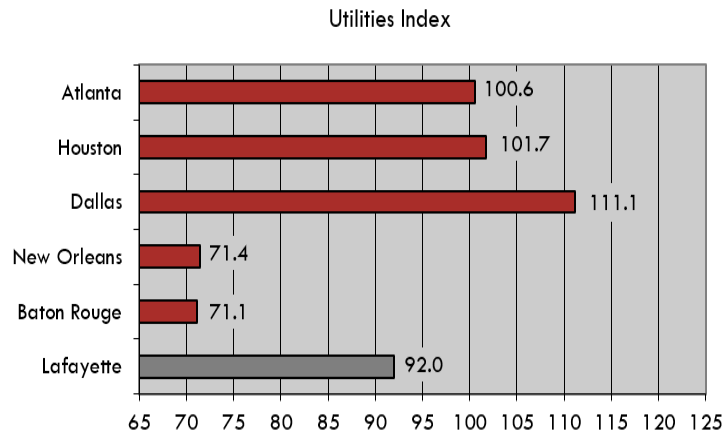

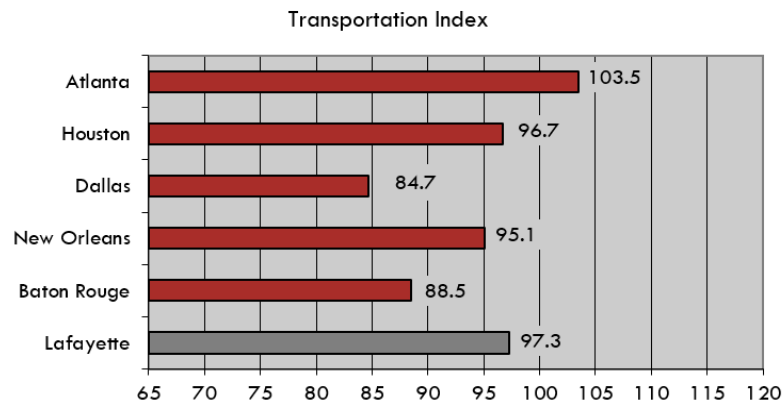

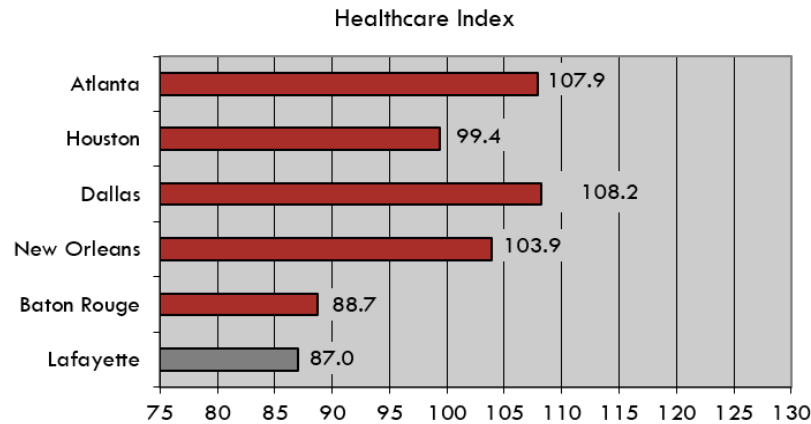

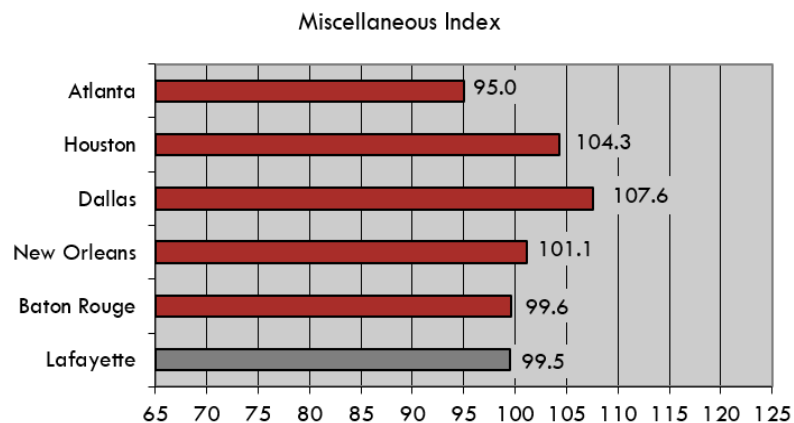
